Practice Emergency Medicine in a classic New England coastal environment.

- The Block Island Medical Center Elective combines rural emergency medicine, family medicine and urgent care.
- We are the only source of health care for Block Island's year round population of approximately 1000 to its summer tourist visitors of 500,000.
- In the summer we see from 30-50 patients during per day.
- Moped and boating trauma; beach and water-sports injuries; Lyme, Babesiosis and other tick-born illnesses; ACS including AMI's, CVA's and Sepsis.
- We are not a hospital and most of what we do is stabilize, perform acute interventions and transport off by helicopter or plane.
- On site we do our own x-rays and bedside ultrasounds.
- Walk to work from your cottage. (5 minutes)
- Housing provided in a beach cottage 2 blocks from the Medical Center.
- 2-3 Brown Med Student rotators every month.
- Relaxed, educational, busy and fun atmosphere.
- You carry a radio to respond to emergencies after hours on call days.
- You will work hard but will also have ample time for *hiking, biking, beach days and relaxing in a stunning environment.*
