# **Focus On: Interventional Radiology**

Our Vascular and Interventional Radiology team uses X-rays and other diagnostic images to guide catheters and tiny instruments through blood vessels or skin to the site of illness. These nonsurgical treatments often result in less pain, less time in recovery and less scarring (if any). Most interventional radiology procedures require only light intravenous sedation and patients usually go home the same day.

Sumeet Bahl, MD, and Brett Welke, MD (shown below), TBHC's interventional radiologists, treat the following:



#### Women's health

- Uterine fibroid embolization
- Gonadal vein embolization for pelvic congestion
- Hysterosalpingography for infertility

#### Men's health

- Prostate artery embolization for enlarged prostate
- Gonadal vein embolization for varicocele

# Interventional oncology (cancer diagnosis and treatment)

- Port placement for chemotherapy
- Biopsy
- Tunneled pleural and peritoneal catheters for malignant ascites

### Visceral and renal angiography

- Splenic artery embolization for enlarged spleen
- Renal artery angioplasty for hypertension

#### Venous disease

- IVC filter placement and retrieval
- Venous stent placement
- Catheter-directed venous and pulmonary thrombectomy

### **Dialysis** intervention

AV fistulograme

#### Pain management

Joint injection (hip, shoulder, knee, epidural and other)

#### Venous catheter placement

- Peripherally inserted central catheter (PICC) for infusions
- Tunneled hemodialysis catheter

#### **Urinary intervention**

Nephrostomy tube placement


## Hey TBHC, Get Your Seasonal Vaccines!


Every TBHC staffer must get their flu shot. If you cannot get vaccinated for medical reasons or refuse the shot for any other reason, you will have to remain masked once flu season is officially declared by New York State (usually some time in December). The best time to get vaccinated for your own protection is in the autumn.

This season is also an ideal time to get the Covid 2024-2025 vaccine, which can be given with the flu shot. While Covid has proven to be a year-round virus, we know that the peak season is from Thanksgiving through mid-January. As such, the best protection is provided by getting vaccinated for Covid in November. However, if you are traveling or might be attending other large events, you may want to take that into consideration. Dr. Robert DiGregorio, Chief Pharmacotherapy Officer, is happy to have a decision-making conversation with you about the timing of the Covid and/or influenza vaccine. Call him at x8182.

**If you are opting to just get the required influenza shot,** you can get it at Employee Health Services (see hours on graphic). There will also be "clinics" where you can get your shots in the Cafeteria further into the season. Keep your eye out for those upcoming dates.


### ONE PATIENT'S EXPERIENCE Healing Fast With Robotic Hernia Surgery
